Born in Bradford: Age of Wonder Data Dashboard available for schools

The Data Dashboard is an interactive data platform with Age of Wonder Data from schools all across Bradford. The unique platform provides insight into important topics of student and school life in Bradford. The data of over 8000 students helps us understand the needs of teenagers and where we can create change. Comparisons can be made with national references and the whole AOW cohort to help recognise differences in your students.



Teachers wanted to contribute to eating disorder research.

Data shows that eating disorders and mental health issues are on the rise in children and young people, particularly those at secondary age. A large percentage of these young people are undiagnosed and thus cannot access support. We are seeking teachers who are interested in the topic of disordered eating to form a working group which will support BiB's research into the area.
