Help Us Protect Babies from RSV

Are you pregnant and giving birth in Bradford?

We are inviting pregnant women to join a new research study looking at how babies develop protection against Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV) – a common virus that can cause serious illness in young children, especially those born early.

What's involved?

There are two parts to the study:

- **Part 1**
Collecting samples from mums and babies at the time of birth to look for RSV protection
- **Part 2**
Collecting samples from babies at 6 months old to look for RSV protection

There will also be a short questionnaire to complete about you and your baby's health, and more general information about your household.

Why Take Part?

Your participation will help us:

- Understand how babies develop protection against RSV
- Compare protection in premature vs. full-term babies
- Explore how long protection lasts for babies when vaccination against RSV is given in pregnancy.
